Teams will compete by racing Pirate boats against each other along the Six Mile Water River.



The boats are replica Pirate ships, ten metres in length and are crewed by two Pirates and your team of eight oarspeople.

Each team will race against the clock and the quickest teams will go through to a grand finale.

Teams will also have the opportunity to compete in a 'Knockout' Challenge.



How To Take Part?

A minimum of 10 teams will race, 8 oars people per team. Entry fee is £50.00 per team member. £100.00 deposit secures your team your place.

All insurance, medical personnel and safety equipment is provided. Bring warm and practical clothing on the day, although we do encourage participants to dress as Pirates.

Lough Neagh is the largest lake in the British Isles being approx 20 miles long and 9 miles wide. It is generally shallow with an average depth in the main body of the Lough of 30'(9m) but very shallow round the margins of the Lough. The Lough is very exposed and in windy conditions it can become extremely rough very quickly. It is used extensively by a wide variety of recreational and commercial craft.
